When was the last time you did something for your community? When was the last time you took initiative in solving a problem? When was the last time you really felt an active citizen?

Nowadays we hear very often the idea of active citizenship and of taking responsibility for our communities. Do we really believe in all these? I would say rather no. A lot of people from our world would say that this is not possible because each one has its own interests and we are all so selfish. Bogusandra is a woman from the planet... She initiated the changes she wanted to see in her community and she succeeded both in mobilizing the rest of the community and in bringing a change inside the community.

1. Bogusandra, please tell us more about the community you are coming from:

I come from a community where there are very different types of persons. You will find people that have high living standards, others that have low living standards and also persons that are between the extremes. The most important thing that we have now is respect and empathy;

we respect ourselves and also the others and we understand each other. It wasn't always like this but we all decided this the way we have to choose and everyone is winning.

2. Even if your world is better than ours, is still not perfect, right? What are the main problems or needs that you encountered in your community?

Of course we still have problems. The idea is to find solutions for each problem we identify, there is always a need for improving our lives. For example, I come from a very small community and we didn't have too many cultural activities. I felt the need for doing more cultural activities, for meeting and sharing experiences with the other members of the community and also for my children, there was no place for playing with the other children. Recently, we realized most of the parents don't talk to their children about sexuality and family life. We decided to have meeting with the school headmaster in order to convince him to organize sexual education activities in the school both with students and parents. That's what we are planning to do in the future. If you speak to the people in the community you will always find their needs, you never run out of them.

3. What is your biggest achievement until now, in terms of changes made in your community?

As I said before, I felt that need for a meeting place. Then I started to talk to the other members of the community about the need identified by me and we discovered many people had the same feelings. So we decided we can do something in commune. We started to meet once per week and we kept talking about our needs and ideas and we all agreed we need something like a community centre, a place for meeting and sharing, and also inclusive for each person in the community. We imagined our perfect community centre and then we started to put in practice

our ideas. In the beginning everyone was very skeptical about succeeding and they thought we are just talking and nothing will happen in reality. One day we just said we can do it and we started a fundraising campaign in the community. Even if we didn't expect a lot of people started to donate their money and we also had one cultural event where our children presented different things like dances, music and theatre plays and people from the community bought tickets for the event.

After we raised all the money needed for establishing the community centre, we realized a meeting with the local authorities and they decided to contribute with money for it and to help with all the authorizations.

In one year of working, we succeeded. Now we have a community centre where we can meet and share experiences. It was a long and difficult way, but now we know we can do it on our own.


4. What are the main characteristics this world owns now that make you say that now we are in a world worth living at?

GET2SUN GAME

Get2Sun is a board game developed in Cyprus by Viktoria Kulinska and Kjazim Caro in 2016.

The game was issued at March 2016th and sold about 70 million copies, driven by huge popularity among German troops serving in a kitchen of their hotel. It is a cross and circle game with the circle collapsed onto the cross, similar to the Indian game Pachisi, the Colombian game Parqués, the American games Parcheesi, Aggravation, and Trouble, and the English game Ludo.

The game can be played by 2, 3 or 4 players – one player per board side (the original board has a pattern for 6 players on the reverse). Each player has 4 game pieces, which are in the "out" area when the game starts, and which must be brought into the player's "home" row. Early games had painted wooden pieces.

The rows are arranged in a cross pattern. They are surrounded and connected with a circle of fields, over which the game pieces move in clockwise direction. There are 3 fields nearest to each side of the board; the left one is the player's "start" field (marked "S") and the middle one leads to the "home" row.

This means that each game piece enters the circle at the "start" field, moves (clockwise) over the board and finally enters the "home" row. The first player with all of their pieces in their "home" row wins the game.

The players throw a die in turn and can advance any of their pieces in the game by the thrown number of dots on the die. Throwing a six means bringing a piece into the game (by placing one

from the "out" area onto the "start" field) and throwing the die again. In some variants, a player who has no pieces in the game has three tries to throw a six. If a piece is on the "start" field and there are still pieces in the "out" area, it must be moved as soon as possible. If a piece cannot be brought into the game than any other piece in the game must be moved by the thrown number, if that is possible. Pieces can jump over other pieces, and throw out pieces from other players (into that player's "out" area) if they land on them. A player cannot throw out his own pieces though, and cannot advance further than the last field in the "home" row. A player cannot be thrown out if he is on his "start" field.
