






The country environment

Here are some tips for writing a good resume, hope you find them useful.

The Do's

- ✓ Keep it in one page.
- ✓ Volunteering is also experiences. So if you want employers take it seriously. Put your volunteer experiences in the experiences tab.
- ✓ Pick your social accounts wisely. If you are not doing a business with Facebook or you are not showing your works on Instagram
- ✓ Include figures. e.g.: The precise number of staff you managed or the exact budget size of the project.
- ✓ Be quantitative as well as qualitative. Show proves to validate your claims with examples;
- ✓ Focus on what you can offer the employer and pick your skills and experience relevant rather than just listing what you have done.
- ✓ Take advices from your trusted colleagues and friends if your CV representing you accuretly.
- ✓ Seek feedback if you are not achieving any interviews. If you feel your CV is not reflecting you at your best seek external advice.
- ✓ Prefer short sentences. This way it's more easy to scan, especially many recruiters giving an attention just 10 seconds to skim read.
- ✓ Be quantitative as well as qualitative. Show proves to validate your claims with examples;
- ✓ Rely on relevant content. Don't put any unreleted information.



The Don'ts

- ✓ You shouldn't put a date on your CV to reuse
- ✓ Don't put your irrelevant personal details like date of birth and nationality.
- ✓ You should mention to salary you are expecting.
- ✓ Don't put any unreal information.
- ✓ Don't forget to attach your cover letter to your CV.
- ✓ Don't afraid to leave gaps in that way it will be much easier to scan.
- ✓ Don't use any crazy colours and fonts
- ✓ Don't include unnecessary references.
- ✓ Don't include negative informations like failed exam or interview



Eu oportunities for youth to gain work or other experiences




